Australia Awards Scholarships in Laos

Australia's international development assistance in Laos helps promote prosperity, reduce poverty, and enhance political stability.

Australia Awards Scholarships (AAS) are prestigious international awards offered by the Australian Government to the next generation of global leaders in developing countries. Through study and research, recipients develop the skills and knowledge to drive change and help build enduring people-to-people links with Australia.

Applicants are assessed on their professional and personal qualities, academic competence and, most importantly, their potential to impact on development challenges in eligible countries.

Applications are strongly encouraged from women, people with disabilities and other marginalised groups.

Applicants living with a disability and people living in the provinces are entitled to additional support and are strongly encouraged to contact the Laos Australia Institute (LAI) Awards Team (contact details are on the last page) for additional information.

Fields of study supported by the AAS

In recognition of the genuine development challenges across all sectors in Laos, applications are encouraged from all fields of study, **except for general business courses (e.g., business, business administration, business management, finance, and accounting), and education management.**

Applicants should select courses that align with their experience and qualifications or provide a strong justification for courses that represent a shift in career focus or direction.

Priority fields of study

The governments of Australia and Laos regularly review priority fields of study together and adjust the emphasis of the program. For Intake 2026, the following fields of study are human resource development priorities:

- **Economic development and trade:** economic governance, entrepreneurship and innovation, tourism and hospitality management, international trade, commerce, agribusiness, food science and technology, and quality and standard management.
- **Environment, climate change and clean energy:** environmental adaptation and resilience, waste management, clean energy, renewable energy, climate financing, disaster resilience and management, water resource management, forest and wildlife conservation, natural resource management, sustainable agriculture, and food security.
- **Gender, disability and social inclusion:** gender studies, disability policy and practices, inclusive and specialised education, women's studies, social work, development studies, community service, youth work and international community development.
- **Governance and law:** public policy, public administration and management, public relations, international relations, international law, law and development, social justice, human rights, intellectual property law, legal studies, and monitoring and evaluation.
- **Health and wellbeing:** public health, allied health, emergency operation management, communicable disease, epidemiology, animal health, aged care, medical technology, nutrition and dietetics, food safety, occupational health and safety, mental health, and psychology.
- **Human resource development and education:** human resource management and development, early childhood, basic education, teaching English to speakers of other languages (TESOL), pedagogy and leadership management.
- **Infrastructure and connectivity:** engineering, cyber security, critical technology (AI, robotics, etc.), information technology, digital studies, data science and innovation, journalism and multi-media communication, logistics and supply chain management, construction and infrastructure management, urban planning, building design, graphic design, interior design, and architecture.

Level of study

Australia Awards Scholarships provide citizens of Laos with the opportunity to obtain a qualification at an Australian tertiary institution, including technical colleges.

Awards will be offered for commencement in 2026 within the following levels of study:

- **Vocational Education and Training (VET)**¹: diploma and advanced diploma
- **Master's degree**
- **Doctorate degree (PhD).**

Mekong Australia Partnership (MAP) Scholarship

In 2026, additional Australia Awards Scholarship will be available for Laos, funded by the Australian Government's Mekong-Australia Partnership (MAP). Australia Awards Scholarships funded by MAP are prestigious international awards offered by the Australian Government to the next generation of leaders from Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam to undertake **Masters level** coursework or research in priority fields aligning with MAP's key thematic areas: **water security, climate action, transnational crime, economic resilience and subregional integration, and gender equality, disability and social inclusion.**

Scholars will have exclusive access to the Mekong-Leaders Network, a dynamic enrichment program that includes events and development opportunities that foster collaboration and enduring connections between MAP scholars across the Mekong subregion.

Australia Awards benefits

Australia Awards Scholarships are offered for the minimum period necessary for the individual to complete the academic program specified by the Australian education institution, including any preparatory training.

Scholarship recipients will receive the following:

- return air travel
- a one-off establishment allowance on arrival
- full tuition fees
- contribution to living expenses
- Introductory Academic Program (IAP)
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of the scholarship
- supplementary academic support
- fieldwork allowance for research students and masters by coursework which has a compulsory fieldwork component.

Eligibility criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the **Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook** at <https://www.dfat.gov.au/about-us/publications/australia-awards-scholarships-policy-handbook>

Country-specific conditions

In addition to the eligibility requirements, candidates from Laos must also meet the following conditions:

- be a citizen of Laos
- be aged between 18 and 50 years old as of 31 December 2025
- have been residing in the Lao PDR for a minimum of one year as of 30 April 2025 (exceptions may be considered for Government Officials who have had diplomatic postings overseas)
- declare all previous studies undertaken irrespective of whether it is complete or incomplete
- declare all previous and current international scholarships awarded
- provide all the required supporting documents listed under "Supporting documents", and
- must be ready to commence full-time Pre-departure Academic Preparation (either English Academic Preparation in October or Academic Readiness Course in November 2025).

VET applicants:

- must have completed upper secondary school, or
- will complete upper secondary school by 30 September 2025, or
- currently studying at tertiary level, or
- who already have a Diploma or a Bachelor's degree, must have a minimum of two years' work experience and be seeking qualifications to fill a skills shortfall or to change career direction.

Master's degree applicants:

- must hold a Bachelor's degree or equivalent and
 - must have a minimum of two years' work experience.
- * Note: Those who already have a Master's degree from overseas are eligible to apply; but may be given lower priority and must be seeking qualifications in a different field of study.

PhD applicants:

- must hold a Master's degree
 - must have a minimum of three years' work experience and
 - must submit an IELTS Certificate of overall score of at least 6.5 with no individual band less than 6.0 obtained after 30 March 2024.
- * Note: IELTS test fee reimbursement will be paid to PhD applicants who meet all eligibility criteria.

Application dates

For study commencing in Australia in 2026:

Opening date: 1 February 2025

Closing date: 30 April 2025

(20:59 Laos Time or 23:59 Canberra Time)

Applications and/or supporting documents received after the closing date will not be considered.

The application process

Online applications

All applications must be lodged online through (OASIS) at <https://oasis.dfat.gov.au>

All supporting documents must be uploaded to meet the specific eligibility requirements for Laos.

We strongly advise applicants to apply online well before the closing date. The online application facility (OASIS) experiences peak usage in the days leading up to the closing date, and applicants may experience delays.

For those who have no access to the internet and/or people living with a disability who need help to apply, kindly contact our Awards Team at LAI (see contact details on the last page).

Find a university and course

Applicants must have researched their preferred courses and ensure that their courses are included on the **Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)** register.

Applicants are advised to use the CRICOS website **The Australian Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)** at <https://cricos.education.gov.au/> and individual university websites to undertake research about proposed courses of study and clarify:

- if a course is available to international students
- the details of the course content and topics covered
- the English language requirements for selected courses

But applicants do not need to apply separately to your selected university at this stage.

IELTS Requirements

Applicants are not required to submit a valid Academic International English Language Testing System (IELTS) result with their application.

LAI will sponsor one IELTS test for applicants passing the application assessment round who do not have a valid IELTS overall score of 6.5 with no individual band less than 6.0

Preference for interview consideration will be given to applicants with a higher English language level and at least IELTS overall score of 5.5 no individual band less than 5.0 (submitted by 11 July 2025).

* Note: PhD applicants must meet IELTS requirements specified on the country specific conditions section (page 2) of this document.

The selection process

The selection process includes:

- application eligibility checking
- an independent assessment of eligible applications against the selection criteria
- shortlisting
- IELTS preparation and testing
- interviews for shortlisted applicants with the requisite IELTS scores
- a moderation process considering gender, disability, government, non-government and private sectors, levels and areas of study.

Selection criteria

Applicants will be assessed and interviewed against the following criteria:

- academic competence
- potential outcome, specifically the contribution to development outcomes in Laos
- professional and personal leadership attributes including relevant work experience.

Note: Gender balance and other agreed targets may be applied to the selection process. Priority will be given to people with disabilities, people living in the provinces, people from ethnic backgrounds, and applicants from target ministries/organisations.

Australia Awards Scholarships offer more than a degree. You gain an internationally recognised qualification and a life-changing experience in Australia.

Outcomes

All applicants will receive notification at each stage in the selection process if their application is not proceeding further.

Applicants who are interviewed will be notified of the outcomes as soon as possible after the selection process concludes in September 2025.

Successful applicants will remain provisional until meeting the following requirements, or the scholarship offer will be withdrawn:

- the provisional awardee attains the minimum English language requirement for placement, and no less than an overall IELTS score of 6.5 with no band less than 6.0
- the provisional awardee is placed at an Australian university; and
- the provisional awardee is issued with the relevant visa by the Australian Department of Home Affairs.

Awardee travel will be subject to meeting the requirements determined by the Australian Government Department of Home Affairs and Department of Education and by the relevant Australian State or Territory governments.

Provisional awardees will be required to attend:

- course counselling
- English and Academic Preparatory Training
- pre-departure briefing

English and Academic Preparatory training

Successful applicants holding:

- Overall IELTS score of at least 6.5 with no band less than 6.0 will be required to attend an Academic Readiness Course (ARC) program in Vientiane of up to 5 weeks.
- Overall IELTS score of at least 5.5 with no band less than 5.0, and within half point of the score required for course placement will be required to attend an English and Academic Preparation (EAP) program in Vientiane of up to 6 months.

Provisional awardees are not permitted to undertake employment during any preparatory training. A small stipend will be provided. Short absences only from the course may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
