## Australia Awards Scholarships in Laos

Australia's international development assistance in Laos promotes a peaceful, stable and prosperous future for Australia and in the region.

The Australia Awards program aims to support partner countries in achieving their development goals through education, knowledge exchange, and building enduring relationships with Australia. It equips emerging leaders with the skills, networks, and experience needed to contribute to sustainable development and foster international cooperation.

Applicants are assessed on their professional and personal qualities, academic competence and, most importantly, their potential to exercise leadership and impact on development challenges in eligible countries.

Applications from women, people with disability and other marginalised groups are encouraged.

Applicants with disability and people living in the provinces are entitled to additional support and are strongly encouraged to contact the Laos Australia Institute (LAI) Awards Team (contact details are on the last page) for additional information.

## Fields of study supported by the AAS

We welcome applications from passionate individuals across a wide range of fields – except general business course (e.g. business administration, accounting) and education management.

Applicants should select courses that align with their experience and qualifications. If you're considering a shift in career focus or direction, a strong justification will be required.

## Priority fields of study for intake 2027

The priority areas of study for eligible Laos are:

- **Economic development and trade:** economic governance, public financial management, entrepreneurship and innovation, tourism and hospitality management, international trade, commerce, food science and technology, and quality and standard management.
- **Environmental sciences, climate change, clean energy, and energy transition:** environmental adaptation and resilience, environmental management and planning, waste management, clean and renewable energy, climate financing, disaster resilience and management, water resource and supply management, forest and wildlife conservation, wildlife ecology and management, natural resource management, sustainable mineral resource and extractive industry management.
- **Agricultural sciences, agribusiness, food security, and sustainable agriculture:** climate smart farming, agroecology, animal health, animal nutrition, livestock management, food safety and production, veterinary technology, agricultural engineering, crop science, and soil science.
- **Gender, disability, and social inclusion:** gender studies, disability policy and practices, inclusive and specialised education, women's studies, social work, development studies, community service, youth work and international community development.
- **Governance and law:** public policy, public administration and management, international relations, international law, law and development, social justice, human rights, intellectual property law, legal studies, and monitoring and evaluation.
- **Health and wellbeing:** public health, infectious diseases, allied health, reproductive health, emergency operation management, communicable disease, epidemiology, aged care, medical technology, nutrition and dietetics, food safety, occupational health and safety, mental health, and psychology.
- **Human resource development and education:** human resource management and development, early childhood, basic education, vocational education, Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL), pedagogy and leadership management.
- **Infrastructure and connectivity:** engineering, cyber security, critical technology (AI, robotics, etc.), information technology, digital studies, data science and innovation, journalism and multi-media communication, public relations, logistics and supply chain management, construction and infrastructure management, urban planning, building design, graphic design, interior design, and architecture.

The governments of Australia and Laos regularly review these areas of study together and adjust the emphasis of the program. Detailed information on priority areas of study can be found at: **Australia Awards Laos** or <https://australiaawardslaos.org>

### Level of study

Australia Awards scholarships provide citizens of Laos with the opportunity to obtain a qualification at an Australian tertiary institution.

Awards will be offered for commencement in 2027 within the following allocations:

- **Vocational Education and Training (VET):** diploma and advanced diploma
- **Master's degree**
- **Doctoral degree (PhD).**

### Australia Awards Mekong-Australia Partnership (MAP) Scholarship

From 2026, additional Australia Awards Scholarship will be available for Laos, funded by the Australian Government's Mekong-Australia Partnership. The Australia Awards Mekong-Australia Partnership (AA-MAP) are prestigious international awards offered by the Australian Government to the next generation of leaders from Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Vietnam and Myanmar to undertake **Masters level** coursework or research in priority fields aligning with MAP's key thematic and priority areas of study include:

- Water security
- Climate action
- Transnational crime
- Economic resilience and subregional integration
- Gender equality, disability equity and social inclusion

Scholars will have exclusive access to the Mekong Leaders Network, a dynamic on-award enrichment program that includes activities, events and development opportunities that foster collaboration and enduring connections between AA-MAP scholars across the Mekong subregion.

### Australia Awards benefits

Australia Awards scholarships are offered for the minimum period necessary for the individual to complete the academic program specified by the Australian education institution, including any preparatory training.

Scholarship recipients will receive the following:

- return air travel
- a one-off establishment allowance on arrival
- full tuition fees
- contribution to living expenses
- introductory academic program
- overseas student health cover for the duration of the scholarship
- supplementary academic support
- fieldwork allowance for research students and masters by coursework which has a compulsory fieldwork component.

### Eligibility criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the **Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook** at <https://www.dfat.gov.au/about-us/publications/australia-awards-scholarships-policy-handbook>

### Country-specific conditions

In addition to the eligibility requirements, candidates from Laos must also meet the following conditions:

- be a citizen of Laos
- be aged between 18 and 50 years old as of 31 December 2026
- have been residing in the Lao PDR for a minimum of one year as of 30 April 2026 (exceptions may be considered for Government Officials who have had diplomatic postings overseas)
- declare all previous studies undertaken irrespective of whether it is complete or incomplete
- declare all previous and current international scholarships awarded
- provide all the required supporting documents listed under "Supporting documents", and
- must be ready to commence full-time Pre-departure Academic Preparation (either English and Academic Preparation in October or Academic Readiness Course in November 2026).

#### VET applicants:

- must have completed upper secondary school, or
- will complete upper secondary school by 30 September 2026, or
- currently studying at tertiary level but have not completed more than two years, or
- who already have a Diploma or Bachelor's degree must have a minimum of two years' work experience and be seeking qualifications to fill a skills shortfall or to change career direction.

#### Master's degree applicants:

- must hold a Bachelor's degree or equivalent and
- must have a minimum of two years' work experience.

\*Note: Master's degree applicants who hold an existing master's degree from another overseas institutions are eligible to apply, however may be given lower priority to those applicants not holding similar qualifications. Applications will be assessed on whether a second Master's degree will deepen applicant expertise, and for qualifications in a different field of study to the first Master's degree. Those considering a second master's degree are encouraged to consider these conditions and whether applying for PhD study is more appropriate.

#### PhD applicants:

- must hold a Master's degree
- must have a minimum of three years' work experience and
- must submit an IELTS Certificate of overall score of at least 6.5 with no individual band less than 6.0 obtained after 30 March 2025.

\*Note: IELTS test fee reimbursement will be paid to PhD applicants who meet all eligibility criteria.

For study commencing in Australia in 2027:

**Opening date: 1 February 2026**

**Closing date: 30 April 2026**  
**(11:00 Laos Time or 14:00 Canberra Time)**

*Applications and/or supporting documents received after the closing date will not be considered.*

## Online applications

All applications must be lodged online through **OASIS** at <https://oasis.dfat.gov.au>

- Applicants must use their full name exactly as it appears on their passport, including first, middle, and last names.
- Applicants must not use nicknames, shortened versions, or abbreviations of their names.
- All supporting documents must be uploaded to meet the specific eligibility requirements for Laos.
- We strongly advise applicants to apply online well before the closing date. The online application facility (OASIS) experiences peak usage in the days leading up to the closing date, and applicants may experience delays.
- For those who have no access to the internet and/or people living with a disability who need help to apply, kindly contact our Awards Team at LAI (see contact details on the last page).

## Find a university and course

Applicants must have researched their preferred courses and ensure that their courses are included on the **Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)** register.

Applicants are advised to use the **CRICOS** website at <https://cricos.education.gov.au/> and individual university websites to undertake research about proposed courses of study and clarify:

- if a course is available to international student
- the details of the course content and topics covered
- the English language requirements for selected courses

But applicants do not need to apply separately to your selected university at this stage.

## IELTS Requirements

Applicants are not required to submit a valid Academic International English Language Testing System (IELTS) result with their application.

LAI will sponsor one IELTS test for applicants passing the application assessment round who do not have a valid IELTS overall score of 6.5 with no individual band less than 6.0


Preference for interview consideration will be given to applicants with a higher English language level and at least IELTS overall score of 5.5 no individual band less than 5.0 (submitted by 10 July 2026).

\*Note: PhD applicants must meet IELTS requirements specified on the country specific conditions section (page 3) of this document.

## The selection process

- application eligibility checks
- an independent assessment of eligible applications against the selection criteria
- shortlisting
- IELTS preparation and testing
- interviews for shortlisted applicants with the requisite IELTS scores and assessment scores. Applicants will be assessed against the following selection criteria:
  - academic competence
  - potential outcome, specifically the contribution to development outcomes in Laos.
  - professional and personal leadership attributes including relevant work experience.
- a moderation process considering gender; disability; provinces; ethnic minority backgrounds; government, non-government and private sectors; levels; and areas of study.

\*Note: Gender balance and other agreed targets may be applied to the selection process. Priority will be given to people with disabilities, people living in the provinces, people from ethnic minority backgrounds, and applicants from target ministries/organisations.



## Supporting Documents

- Applicants must submit online all the relevant supporting documents listed in the table below.
- Applicants must compile documents into single PDFs by document category, name the files appropriately (e.g. “Certificates”, “Referee Reports”), and ensure that the scanned documents are in colour, legible, in correct page order and orientation.
- Please note that documents do NOT have to be certified at the time of application.
- Applicants should note that a failure to provide all the required documents may lead to the application being deemed ineligible.

**If you are unable to obtain any required documents, you should contact the Awards Team to discuss this as early as possible in the preparation of your application.**

## **Australia Awards Scholarships offer more than a degree. You gain an internationally recognised qualification and a life-changing experience in Australia.**

### **Outcomes**

All applicants will receive notification at each stage in the selection process if their application is proceeding or not proceeding further.

Applicants who are interviewed will be notified of the outcomes as soon as possible after the selection process concludes in September 2026.

**Successful applicants will remain provisional until meeting the following requirements, or the scholarship offer will be withdrawn:**

- the provisional awardee attains the minimum English language requirement for placement, and no less than an overall IELTS score of 6.5 with no band less than 6.0
- the provisional awardee is placed at an Australian university; and
- the provisional awardee is issued with the relevant visa by the Australian Department of Home Affairs.

**Provisional awardees will be required to attend:**

- course counselling
- pre-departure briefing
- English and Academic Preparatory Training
- university's Introductory Academic Program
- other required preparatory study on arrival in Australia


Awardee travel will be subject to meeting the requirements imposed by the Australian Government, as determined by the federal Department of Home Affairs and Department of Education and by the relevant Australian State or Territory governments.

### **Preparatory training**

Successful applicants holding:

- Overall IELTS score of at least 6.5 with no band less than 6.0 may receive an offer for an Academic Readiness Course (ARC) program in Vientiane of up to 6 weeks.
- Overall IELTS score of at least 5.5 with no band less than 5.0, and within half point of the score required for course placement may receive an offer for an English and Academic Preparation (EAP) program in Vientiane of up to 6 months.

Provisional awardees are not permitted to undertake employment during any preparatory training. A small stipend will be provided. Short absences only from the course may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
